

With a bit of paint added after stiffening the paper with some very thin super glue, it blends in to the rest of the model and really, once the bust is attached to a decorative plinth, it's what I like to call 'finished'.

## Conclusion

Okay, I've already mentioned that I like Young Miniatures range of busts. I think they began with some nice offerings in the early days and have managed to improve on those with what are – as far as I've experienced – virtually flawless kits.

I've got to be realistic and say that there are areas that require cleaning up, but that is the nature of the way moulds are made and over-pour blocks have to be allowed for. The presentation, sculpting, moulding and fit of the kit parts are something I can safely say are very good indeed, and with the variety of subjects in the range now, it's a pretty safe bet that most historical modellers will find something to interest them.

I'm tempted to pose the question of whether there might be a German WW1 subject released to mirror this British one... or perhaps a French soldier?
